



Community Bulletin #1 regarding PCD

This bulletin is intended to provide Listuguj members with general information about the PCD application process. Detailed information is provided on the Application Instructions.

Why are we talking about this PCD?	LMG settled five longstanding claims with Canada and received \$64.5 million on May 25, 2015. Listuguj members voted to take \$60 million and pay a one-time lump sum payment or capita distribution (PCD) to each Listuguj member.
What does PCD mean?	PCD stands for Per Capita Distribution. This means funds are distributed on a 'per capita' basis. In this case, it means the Settlement Funds will be distributed to every Listuguj member as a one-time lump sum payment.
Who is eligible for this PCD?	In order to be eligible, applicants must be members of Listuguj as of the Effective Date. The Effective date is the date that Canada signed the agreement, which was April 29, 2015. LMG gave a grace period of one month (until May 29, 2015) for people to complete their applications for membership.
How much is each PCD?	On May 29, 2015 there were 4,013 members on the band list and active applicants. \$60 million divided into 4,013 = \$14,951.41 per member. This is a one-time lump sum payment.
Where do I get a PCD Application form?	Members can pick up their application form and instructions at the LMG office or download and print them from the LMG Facebook page or the LMG web site: www.listuguj.ca . You can also contact the LMG office, provide your mailing address and LMG will mail you the application form and instruction sheet.
How do I submit my PCD application?	<p>Members must choose one of two options to submit their PCD application.</p> <p>Option 1. Submit the Application in Person. This means you will fill out the application form, bring it in person to Listuguj and have it signed and verified.</p> <p>Option 2. Submit the Application by Mail. This means you will fill out the application form, bring it to a Commissioner of Oaths or Notary Public, have it signed and verified and then you will mail it to LMG.</p> <p>The Application Form and the Application Instructions provide more detail on how to do this.</p>
Is there a deadline to	<p>Yes. Five years after:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • June 9, 2015 for all members who are eighteen (18) and older at the date of the establishment by the LMG of the minors' simple trust;

<p>apply?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • reaching the age of eighteen (18) years; or • being registered on the Listuguj Band list by AANDC for those persons (recognized as “active applicants” by AANDC or LMG) who applied for Listuguj membership by thirty (30) days after the Effective Date;
<p>How will I get my money?</p>	<p>There are three options to receive your PCD.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. DIRECT DEPOSIT. This is LMG’s preferred method. It is quick, safe and secure as your money is deposited directly into your bank account. Your money won’t get lost in the mail or held by your bank. 2. CHEQUE IN MAIL. Your cheque will be delivered to the address you indicate on the application form. 3. CHEQUE PICK UP. You will pick up your cheque at the LMG Office.
<p>When will I get my money?</p>	<p>The sooner you get your application approved, the sooner you can be paid. Payments are paid in the order in which applications are approved. Direct Deposit is the quickest method for receiving your PCD. Receiving a cheque by mail may take considerably longer. The first PCD payments will be made June 19, 2015 and every week after that.</p>

<p>What else do I bring with me if I am submitting</p>	<p>You will need to bring:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your application form with all required sections filled out. DO NOT SIGN THIS APPLICATION UNTIL AN LMG CLERK WITNESSES YOUR SIGNATURE.

<p>IN PERSON?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Valid ID's so LMG can verify your identity. The Application Instructions indicate what kinds of ID will be accepted. • A "VOID" cheque or a certificate of personal banking information issued by your branch. <p>Read the Application Instructions for more details.</p>
<p>What else do I do if I am submitting BY MAIL?</p>	<p>You will need to fill out the application form with all required sections filled out. DO NOT SIGN THIS APPLICATION UNTIL A COMMISSIONER OF OATHS OR NOTARY PUBLIC WITNESSES YOUR SIGNATURE.</p> <p>You have to bring your application form and two forms of government-issued valid IDs to a Commissioner of Oaths or a Notary Public in person. To find a Commissioner of Oaths, contact a notary or a lawyer or visit a courthouse. In Quebec, you can visit a Services Quebec counter to access this service. http://www4.gouv.qc.ca/EN/Portail/Citoyens/Evenements/separation-divorce/Pages/services-commissaire-assermentation.aspx In other provinces or other countries, you will have to find out who is authorized to receive solemn declarations.</p> <p>The Commissioner of Oaths or Notary Public must make a copy of the front and back of your ID's and your personal banking information and certify them as 'true'.</p> <p>You will then sign the Applicant Declaration in front of the Commissioner of Oaths. The Commissioner of Oaths will then sign and stamp your application form.</p> <p>Mail the application form, your signed ID and banking documents to:</p> <p>Listuguj Settlement Agreement Coordinator 17 Riverside West.
